
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
Preface

Lita Cabellut was born in 1961 in Spain. Her constant visits to the Prado Museum played a crucial part in her career's decision. After spending hours, meditating on the works of the greatest artists such as Velázquez, Goya and Rembrandt, she decided at the age of thirteen to become a painter. Thus, Cabellut held her first exhibition at the Town Hall of Masnou, Barcelona, when she was seventeen. At nineteen, she left Spain to study at the Rietvield Academy in Amsterdam, the Netherlands, where she remains to live and work. Over the years, Cabellut has developed a unique technique that gives a guality and an uncommon texture to her work. She has exhibited in many museums worldwide, including the Foundation Vila Casas, the Goya Museum and MAC Contemporary Art Museum in Spain, the Contemporary Art Museum in Sicily, Italy, the Museum Jan van der Togt and Museum Jan Cunen in The Netherlands, the Pivot Centre for Art + Culture in Seattle, USA, the Hälsingland Museum in Hudiksvall, Sweden, and the Yuz Museum, in Shanghai, China, to quote a few.

Lita Cabellut portrays a lifetime of endured events. Orphan in the old and mythical area of Barcelona, she suffered from homelessness and loss. Nevertheless, she did not let darkness conquer her, dreaming about being an artist. In this way, the artist's body work is about love, tolerance, comprehension. According to her, art is communication and communication is empathy. She calls for accepting the other, unconditionally.

Understanding her technique is essential to grasp her artistic concept. She uses a particular technique which lends the brushstroke a significant role during the preparation of the surface by provoking wrought cracklings, reflections of her past. Completely versatile, the artist has also recently designed the backdrops, costumes and media coverage for very personal interpretation for the opera Karl V at the Bayerische Staatsoper in Munich, Germany. She also did so for Le Siège De Corinthe by Balocchi and Soumet, at the 2017 edition of the Rossini Opera Festival in Pesaro, Italy.

She has also been one of the Spanish Artist invited to the 8th Beijing International Art Biennale, Sala Hispano Americana, at the National Art Museum of China NAMOC in Beijing, China. Besides, she is involved with several projects in Asia related with theater, music and opera. She has recently recieved numerous prizes and accolades, such as the Award of Excellence in the Cultural Area, the BBVA Microfinance Foundation Exceptional women: the value of an opportunity and even the Award Personality of the Year in Art 2018, granted by the Spanish newspaper El Mundo.

As she depicts herself, Lita Cabellut is not a simple Contemporary portraitist but a "storyteller". Considered an "informal figurative painter", she paints from memory, her characters are echoes of Cabellut's hometown,

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
