

FOREWORD

In an era where the boundary between the digital and the tangible grows increasingly ambiguous, Alex Sutcliffe's exhibition 'Falling in Place' stands out as a testament to the enduring power of painting as a medium of exploration and reinvention. Sutcliffe, born in Chicago in 1997 and now based in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, presents works that pay homage to the tradition of painting while pushing its possibilities within our digitally driven reality.

Across 15 captivating paintings, Sutcliffe delves into the interplay between traditional and contemporary practices. His process prioritises the physical act of painting, layering pigments and textures onto the canvas with meticulous care. These tactile beginnings serve as a foundation for subsequent digital interventions, creating artworks that blur the line between handmade and machine-altered. The effect is a harmonious tension — a visual dialogue where the viewer is invited to consider the boundaries of medium and technique.

At the core of Sutcliffe's approach is a dedication to exploring painting's relevance in an age defined by instant image creation. Rather than allowing the digital to overshadow the craft of painting, he uses it to complement and interrogate it. His manipulation of historical imagery through painterly techniques that echo digital tools — such as erasure and reconstruction — challenges perceptions of what painting can be. The layered surfaces of his works evoke the intricate fragmentation of mosaics or the disorienting distortions of a digital interface, imbuing each piece with a sense of temporal and spatial fluidity.

'Falling in Place' is more than an exhibition; it is an opportunity to reflect on the visual complexities of the contemporary world. Sutcliffe's works resonate as repositories of memory, culture, and innovation, underscoring painting's capacity to evolve and endure. The exhibition captures not only the fragmented nature of modern life but also the potential for connection and meaning amidst its myriad images, celebrating painting as a medium that bridges history and possibility.

ARTIST STATEMENT

Falling in Place
By Alex SUTCLIFFE

'Falling in Place' bridges the intimate and the digital, weaving the rich tapestry of painting's cultural history with the ephemeral artifacts of digital influence. Each piece is a palimpsest of cultural memory, using techniques that morph the familiar into the surreal. Through a process akin to digital editing, I manipulate scans of historical artworks, employing blurring, smudging, and selective erasing. This digital dissection distances each fragment from its origins, creating surfaces where the interplay of texture and layer becomes a playground for visual exploration.

The method I use mirrors the layering common in digital photo editing software, yet it is executed through traditional painting techniques. I build up layers of paint and selectively cut away — with the precision of a digital eraser — to reveal underlying strata. These surfaces, simultaneously soft and sharp, contrast blurred imagery melding into crisp digital contours of a multi-layered collage, resembling the luminous intricacy of stained glass or the fragments of a shattered screen.


'Falling in Place' is my ode to the dualities of painting. It is both an acknowledgment of the medium's illusionistic roots and a celebration of its potential, highlighting how painting can encapsulate the fragmented yet interconnected narratives of our time. It is a meditation on the instability of our image-saturated world and a testament to painting's enduring ability to hold us in its layered embrace.












