## FOREWORD

With great pleasure, we welcome luminary Spanish multimedia artist Manolo Valdés to Opera Gallery London for ‘The Library’, an exhibition of new work spanning painting and sculpture.

More than five years after his last London exhibition, we are delighted to present this exhibition alongside the unveiling of *Los Cristales II* (2024), one of Valdés’ monumental sculptures, nearby in St James’s Square.

Valdés’ work reminds us that art history is a living, breathing thing. It is happening around us today. No artist works in a vacuum, and ‘The Library’ celebrates the ongoing process of influence and inspiration inherent in the process of making art. Symbolising this process, monumental works from Valdés’ *Librería* series are a cornerstone of the exhibition. These carved wooden sculptures represent the canon of art as an ever-expanding resource; each book a small bridge between the past and future.

Alongside these works, we present a series of new pieces by Valdés that reference a number of familiar themes and subjects from art history. Throughout the exhibition, he takes up the dual role of artist and archivist, borrowing motifs from those who went before him and imbuing them with his own unique artistic stamp. In repeating and remixing these images, he reanimates them, breathing new life into the familiar. Ultimately, Valdés is interested in the adaptation and transformation of cultural forms—and the new meanings and interpretations associated with these derivatives. He has made us see masterpieces by Velázquez and Matisse anew.

He approaches each subject with a deft balance of playfulness and seriousness. The history of art presents him with a selection of starting points from which he explores, reaching to the core of the process of image-making by reducing his subjects to their most basic components and recasting them in a variety of two and three-dimensional materials. Within this exploratory practice, though, is an undeniable sense of reverence for what has gone before him

60 years ago, Valdés founded the influential Equipo Crónica group with Rafael Solbes and Juan Antonio Toledo. Their goal was to expose a wider-than-ever audience to the artistic canon using Pop Art-influenced production techniques. Today, that goal is as salient and urgent as ever, and this exhibition can be understood as a continuation of it.

On a recent visit to his Miami studio, the artist told us “I never close the door on a topic, so long as I think I can explore it in a new way.” He continues to reinvent himself and, in doing so, brings us new ways to understand the masterpieces of the past. It is in this spirit that we invite you to enter ‘The Library’.

## MANOLO VALDÉS LIVING LIBRARY

There is always a large crowd in front Velázquez's celebrated and enigmatic group portrait of *Las Meninas* (1656) ("The Maids of Honour") in the Museo del Prado, Madrid. Identically dressed maids (*meninas*) fuss over the 5-year-old Infanta Margarita who Velázquez places centre stage in the painting, dressed in her expensive, white satin dress. One of the maids offers the child a drink from an earthenware cup, while the other bends as if about to whisper something to her. The pretty child is the focus of the portrait, surrounded by her retinue (dwarves and a dog, who are there to entertain her) along with her parents, who are reflected in the mirror at the back of the room. The painter himself stands behind his easel, immortalising this informal moment at the Spanish court.

In the same gallery at the Prado, a couple of paintings away, hangs another court portrait by Velázquez, of Queen Marianna of Austria, the mother of the little Infanta. By contrast, it is a quiet portrait and rarely surrounded by the crowds that flock to *Las Meninas*. The Queen is alone, devoid of any retinue, with only a ticking clock on a table at the back as her companion. It is a stiff and formal portrait, commissioned in 1652 to mark her marriage, three years earlier to King Philip IV of Spain, probably for the purpose of providing a likeness of his new queen which could be sent abroad for diplomatic purposes.

Today considered one of his masterpieces of portraiture, Velázquez presents the Queen in full, magnificent splendour, dressed in the height of Spanish fashion in a black and silver dress adorned with red ribbons and jewellery, including gold chains, bracelets, and a large gold brooch pinned to the bodice. This she wears above a rigid support structure made out of whalebone, wood and intricate cages of wire known as a *guardainfante*, so-called because its dramatically wide hips could skilfully mask pregnancy. Queen Marianna had only recently given birth to the Infanta Margarita and was already pregnant with her next child.

This painting has long attracted the attention of the Valencian artist, Manolo Valdés (b. 1944). Over the last thirty years, Valdés has made a body of work, in a variety of media, inspired by Velázquez's portrait of Queen Marianna. Among his many reworkings of the portrait are large full-length sculptures, sometime larger than life, made of wood, bronze, metal, alabaster and even lapis lazuli. Valdés also uses Murano glass and Chinese ceramics to bring out the decorative qualities of the expensive fabrics that decorate the Queen's dress and headdress.

In this exhibition we are guided through a number of such works, as well as sculptures and paintings that allude to other recognisable artistic subjects such as that of Henri Matisse's *La femme au chapeau* (1905). Their presentation is juxtaposed with sculptures from Valdés' ongoing *Librería* series: towering shelves housing countless carved wooden books. This combination echoes the artist's own studio, where works in progress sit alongside his personal library. Here, the history books are in constant conversation with the present. Each time he revisits a familiar form or figure contained within their pages, he is inspired to rework them and bring them up to date and make them part of the world of today. History, he seems to be telling us, is a living, breathing thing. Velázquez's Queens and Infantas are summoned from the pages of his books and brought into the present, with the artist constantly exploring new materials and techniques and working on a large three dimensional format. In 'The Library' Valdés recasts and reimagines the past, constantly updating and pushing boundaries.

Valdés grew up in the 1960s in Valencia when Spain was still in the grip of Francisco Franco's regime and history lessons at school pronounced the concept of the Divine Right of Kings and the supremacy of the Catholic Church. He would have been familiar with the dramatic historical context in which Velázquez's portrait of Marianna had been conceived; with no

male heir the Hapsburg throne, Marianna wed at the age of 12 her Spanish cousin, Prince Baltasar Carlos. Tragically, a year into their marriage, the Prince's died of smallpox. There was no other solution then to marry the Prince's father who was also Marianna's uncle, King Philip IV. She would have just been fourteen years old and only sixteen when she gave birth to the Infanta Margarita.

The icons of Spanish art history at the Museo del Prado proved to be the perfect fertile ground for Valdés and his Valencian contemporaries, Rafael Solbes and Juan Antonio Toledo, who in 1965 founded an avant

garde/art collective called Equipo Crónica (roughly translating as "Chronic Team", the group produced work collectively). In an interview with Tate in September 2015 Valdés explains that their point of reference were the great works in the Museo del Prado:

"We relied heavily on historical painting, which we converted into pop. For us the Museo del Prado represented the utmost expression of popular culture. Its contents became our main source of inspiration and through our pop language we transformed legendary paintings belonging to the Spanish tradition – Goya, Velázquez – into prints for wide distribution... We were fascinated by these iconic paintings that appeared everywhere in picture books, photographs and drawings... Ultimately, we decided to revisit them ironically."<sup>1</sup>

Often described as a version of Pop Art with a pertinent political inclination, Valdés' and his group Equipo Crónica is recognised today as one of the most important avant garde artistic movements in 20<sup>th</sup> century Spain. When asked to explain the influence of Pop Art in their work Valdés responded that:

"We used 'pop' but questioned it. We took the images (language) but knew it had to be different from the United States. We felt that American pop lacked the political content. Lichtenstein, Warhol could be useful, but we had ahead of us quite a distinct challenge, as we faced a political situation very different from that encountered by US artists. Thus to us pop was a means to engage in a political battle, but also a way out and against the domineering artistic tendencies associated with Informel."<sup>2</sup>

One of the most striking coloured prints by Equipo Crónica is *La rendición de Torrejón* (1970) (*The Surrender of Torrejón*), a reworking of Velázquez's *The Surrender of Breda*, a painting commissioned by Philip IV as part of a large royal commission in the 1630s to celebrate Spanish global domination. It shows the Dutch army handing over the keys of the Dutch town


of Breda following its siege in 1624 to the Spanish army. In their characteristically irreverent approach, Equipo Crónica uses the composition and the symbolic notion of the painting to denounce political events of 1953, alluding to the treaty signed between Franco's government and the United States on the occasion of the opening of American military bases on Spanish territory, in this case large US military air base, a political event that was interpreted as a concession to the interests of a foreign power in the context of the Cold War. The Dutch army have become a defeated Spanish army handing over a sword (instead of a key) to the Americans. Readapting such a key work was part of Crónica's mantra, "Although the imagery we were drawing on was well known among the general audience, we still felt we were doing something new with it. Ours was a type of political painting, that wanted to tackle directly and effectively the issues of the time. We wanted it to be clear and to the point. We exhibited in group exhibitions against the dictatorship."<sup>3</sup>

Following the death of Franco in 1975 and the wrapping up of Equipo Crónica's activities in 1981, Valdés moved to New York to embark on a solo career and continue his practice as a painter as well as taking up sculpture. While 20<sup>th</sup> century artists such as Matisse and Picasso continue to provide him with inspiration, particularly in his portrait studies using mixed media, Velázquez's Queen Marianna remains a recurrent theme. Most recently, he has been focusing on Marianna's head and shoulders transforming her headdress into flying butterflies and small panes of glass made from Murano glass of all colours. These transparent sheets of glass let the light come through and energise the central part of the sculpture mimicking the playful quality of the painted satin ribbons with which Velázquez adorns Marianna's braided wig.

Now in his ninth decade, Valdés's new exhibition, 'The Library', presents a body of new work much of it derived from the icons of Spanish art history — but this time made at a distance from his home, in his studios on Long Island and in Miami. Sometimes it is the separation from one's homeland that brings it into sharper focus. Francisco de Goya too left his homeland at the age of

78 and travelled to Paris and Bordeaux producing a whole new body of work but always looking back to his artistic heritage especially the Museo del Prado, which was founded in 1819, and which Goya is known to have visited. The distant memories of Velázquez's Marianna, alone in the Prado's galleries are poignant and as Valdés said recently, "No hay límites, los límites son mis propios límites" ("There are no limits, limits are

only my own limits"). Goya had a similar outlook. In one of his last drawings made at the age of 82, he shows a bearded old man advancing slowly with the help of his walking stick. Beneath the figure he inscribed, "Aun aprendo" ("I am still learning").



## BIOGRAPHY



Manolo Valdés was born in Valencia, Spain, in 1942.

Barely a year after entering the Escuela de Bellas Artes de San Carlos in Valencia in 1957, where he met his future colleagues from Equipo Crónica, the young Valdés embarked on his career as a painter. With the group Estampa Popular, Valdés used his painting to criticise the Franco dictatorship. In 1964, he exhibited at the XVI Salon de la Jeune Peinture organised in Paris by Arroyo, Aillaud and Recalcati. Together with his two friends Rafael Solbes and Joan Antoni Toledo, he decided to form Equipo Crónica, whose aesthetic approach was characterised by its strong narrative vocation at a time dominated by Art Informel and Expressionism. The collective was then inspired by American Pop Art, adopting its codes but giving them a completely different dimension. From 1965 onwards, the collective, consisting exclusively of Valdés and Solbes, took part in numerous exhibitions, acquiring a notoriety that extended beyond Spain's borders.

After the death of Rafael Solbes in 1981, which led to the dissolution of the collective, Manolo Valdés began a solo career. As a connoisseur of art history, he reinterpreted the masterpieces of the past. With Diego Velázquez, he approaches the mysteries of *Las meninas*; with Pablo Picasso, he resorts to the geometry of the Cubist portrait; with Henri Matisse, he pays homage to the first Fauvist painting, *Femme au chapeau*; and with Jan Van Eyck, he reinterprets the brilliance of colour and light in the self-portrait *Portrait of a Man (Self Portrait?)*. With just a few strokes, he captures the lines and contours of an iconic image, revisiting our classics almost obsessively, giving them an unprecedented modernity. The figure of Mariana de Austria by Velázquez, already known from the Equipo Crónica period, becomes a leitmotif. Valdés has lived in New York since 1990, where he creates powerful works, skilfully mastering unusual materials with expressive textures such as jute canvas, folded, stitched or treated with paints and various materials such as tar. The hardness of the materials coincides with the strength of the symbol: an eyebrow or the bridge of a nose is enough to evoke a masterpiece of the past, consecrated, thanks to Valdés, with a new modernity. The result is highly aesthetic. In 1984 he received the Premio Nacional de Bellas Artes and a year later the Medalla de la Pintura Española. In 1999 he represented Spain at the XLVIII Biennale di Venezia. In 2002 the Guggenheim in Bilbao held the exhibition 'Manolo Valdés. Pintura y Escultura' where an excellent dialogue is established between both artistic languages. Later, in 2006, the Museo Reina Sofía announced the exhibition 'Manolo Valdés (1981 – 2006)', which showcased a comprehensive survey of his work. On a monumental scale, his sculptural work has been seen in public spaces around the world. Most recently at the Place Vendôme in Paris (2016) and at the Ciutat de les Arts i les Ciències in Valencia (2017). In sculpture he works with materials such as wood, bronze, brass, alabaster and marble, among others. Today, his work appears in the collections of the most important museums around the world: the MoMA and the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the Centre Pompidou in Paris, the Kunstmuseum in Berlin and the Museo Reina Sofía in Madrid, among others.

Manolo Valdés currently lives and works between New York (USA) and Madrid (Spain).
